Course Description	Directed Self-Study: a learning experience, guide to resources and skill development on what is in the recently passed voluminous and complex health reform laws. The participant tailors portions of the learning experience by selecting materials to read and topics/key words to search on in the legislation. It uses non-partisan, government and some partisan resources. These include the actual bills (Patient Care and Affordability Act - HR 3590 and Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act - HR 4872); summaries by the bi-partisan Congressional services ((i.e., Congressional Research Service (CRS), Congressional Budget Office (CBO)); non-partisan / non-profit organizations; plus the White House and political parties. Other materials are from the Internal Revenue Service, Small Business Administration, and Department of Health and Human Services. The skill development section has the participant search for information her/his clients and stakeholders need to know. The learner participates in an online self-study and –paced without regard to time or location.




### Using the Find bar

To start searching for text on a page:

Open the Find bar:

- Use the Ctrl+F keyboard shortcut.
- Click on the Edit menu, then select Find.

Type a search phrase into the Find Bar's **Find:** field. Firefox will start highlighting instances of your search phrase as you type.



# The Bills Signed into Law (HR3590 & HR4872)

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- 1. In Internet Explorer, click the **Edit** menu, and then click **Find on this Page** to display the text box on the tab row.
- 2. In the text box on the tab tow, type the word or phrase you want to find on this page. The number of matches found will appear next to the **Options** button, and the page will automatically scroll to the first occurrence of the word or phrase.
- 3. To go to the next or previous instance of the word or phrase, click the **Next** or **Previous** button.
